We are excited to once again welcome the Collie Club of America to Boise, ID for the 2017 National Specialty, March 25-April 1. We will be at the Idaho Expo again, which was the home of the successful, profitable 2006 National Specialty. We will be using BaRay Events as our superintendent. This is a beautiful property with over 20 acres of lawn for walking dogs and RV parking. We are pleased to be able to offer all events at the same venue, including herding. Not only will all events be at the same location, but you will never be more than a 2 minute walk from any event going on during the week! Conformation showing and reserved grooming will be housed in the Exposition Center, a 72,000 square foot building, where the show was held in 2006. This building is the home to an annual all breed cluster with a typical entry of 1,500 dogs. The show rings and vendors will be located in the center room of the building, and the attached wings on either side will house the reserved grooming spaces. As in 2006, the building can accommodate 375 grooming spaces.

Obedience and Rally will be housed in the Premium building, which is 7,200 square feet. The building is mere steps from the main building, so offers convenience to exhibitors, while also allowing them a quiet place with minimum disturbances for the event.

Herding will be held Saturday and Sunday, March 25-26, and will be held on the grounds, and will be held outside in two animal show rings, dependent upon weather. Experienced livestock will be brought in for the two day trial. We are planning to offer trials in sheep and ducks. We will be offering HIC testing as well.

Agility will be held Monday and Tuesday, March 27-28, and will be held in the draft horse barn, which is located just to the East of the Premium building. The draft horse barn offers a packed dirt floor and over 28,000 square feet of open, useable space. The draft horse barn will also be available for herding in the case of inclement weather.

The Riverside Hotel will serve as the CCA Host Hotel. It is located 2.9 miles from the show site. Also our host hotel in 2006, they are now under new ownership, and the hotel, including all guest rooms, has been completely renovated. They are a full service hotel, and in addition to a restaurant serving breakfast, lunch, and dinner, they have a bar open nightly, offering live music each night. And for the sweet tooth, they also have a selection of fresh baked, warm cookies daily! They are located on the greenbelt of the Boise River, and offer over 20 acres of green space for walking dogs. They welcome dogs, with no pet fee. They have guaranteed CCA room rates of \$109 plus tax for queen and king rooms. Additionally, they have a variety of meeting rooms available for our use. The Red Lion Hotel will serve as our secondary host hotel. They are located 3.5 miles from the show site. They are also a full service hotel, and have just completed a full renovation of all guest rooms. They are also located adjacent to the Boise River greenbelt, and are dog friendly. The Boise Tourism Board is eager to welcome us back to the city, and has played a vital role in facilitating this bid, including offering a grant from the city of \$3,000, to be used toward sponsorship of the show. They have provided names of hotels/motels within a 5-mile radius of the show site, all of which are dog friendly. In addition to the Riverside Hotel and the Red Lion Hotel, some of these include Candlewood Inn & Suites, The Boise Hotel, Best Western, Hampton Inn, Holiday Inn Express, Motel 6, Inn America, Residence Inn Boise, Oxford Suites, Safari Inn, TownePlace Suites, Super 8, Springhill Suites, and Shilo Inn.
