#### SHOW RULES COMMITTEE CHANGES

The National Show Rules Committee chaired by Joe Reno presents the following changes to the present National Show Rules document.

#### **CHANGES MADE and SECTIONS**

7. B. 17 If the show is canceled due to acts of nature,	war, or other matters	outside the control	of the club, th	ne Host Show
Committee, in conjunction with the National Show Co	ommittee, shall detern	nine what, if any, re	efunds shall be	e given.

8.L. Show cancellation: If the show is canceled due to acts of nature, war, or other matters outside the control of the club, the club will reimburse the Judge for expenses incurred to them prior to the cancellation notice being conveyed to them. This reimbursement will be only for expenses that cannot be canceled or refunded.

8.M. Judge cancellation: If the Judge must cancel or is unable to fulfill their contract for any reason, neither fees nor expenses will be paid by the club. Judges should please give the club immediate notice if they become aware of the fact that they must cancel so that the club may make alternate arrangements for their assignment.

10.B.9. If the show is canceled due to acts of nature, war, or other matters outside the control of the club, the three scheduled conformation Judges will have the option of judging the next scheduled National, whose judges have not been determined.

App. A. 7. If the show is canceled due to acts of nature, war, or other matters outside the control of the club, the club will reimburse the Judge for expenses incurred to them prior to the cancelation notice being conveyed to them.

App. A. 8. If the Judge must cancel or is unable to fulfill their contract for any reason, neither fees nor expenses will be paid by the club. Judges should please give the club immediate notice if they become aware of the fact that they must cancel so that the club may make alternate arrangements for their assignment.

App. A. font sized down to fit all on one page

App. C. 7. Please forward to those who reside or participate in dog events in Wyoming:

The Wyoming Senate continues to consider how to address the issue of animals being seized, and the payment of their care during impoundment.

Both Senate Bills 24 and 25 would require those whose animals are seized on suspicion of cruelty to pay a bond to cover the costs of care while the animals are impounded.

AKC <u>expressed significant concerns</u> with Senate Bill 24, which could have caused someone

to permanently lose ownership of their animals if they fail to pay for care – even if they are found not guilty. The Senate Agriculture, State, Public Lands, & Water Committee tabled this bill and it will not advance.

Senate Bill 25 is a better alternative in some respects, but AKC is asking for specific clarifications that affirmatively protect the rights of innocent animal owners. This bill has been reassigned to the Senate Judiciary Committee.

The Wyoming Legislature is wrapping up an 8-day virtual session this week, and with few exceptions will not be scheduling hearings again until the end of February. AKC will continue to monitor this issue and provide more information when it is available. For questions, contact AKC GR at doglaw@akc.org.

# Notice of Extension of CCA Shining Star Application Deadline to February 10, 2021

Every year, the CCA honors our "Shining Star" collies, collies that work as service dogs, therapy dogs, library/school dogs, search and rescue dogs or otherwise do good deeds for their family or the community. The program is open to all collies and their humans, applicants do not have to be CCA members.

We are presently accepting applications for the Shining Star program; the closing date has been extended to February 10th, 2021.

We do realize that the pandemic has affected all of us. Many hospitals, nursing homes, and other medical facilities, as well as libraries have halted therapy dog visits. Accordingly we are opening the program up to collies that have done their community work over the past two years, not just 2020.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

1. Motion: A motion was made on December 30, 2020, by Nancy Anstruther, DD Canada and seconded by Ann Ferguson, DD Washington state

I move that we have Mr. Beck copy the 1998, 99, 2000, 01, 02, 03,04, & 05 CCA National Videos from VHS to DVD for a price of less than 200 dollars.

2. Discussion regarding the front and back covers of the Yearbook. The Editor has indicated that she has plans to have the Top Winning Rough and Smooth on the front and back covers using the consideration of their rankings on the Hawkins point system as her guide.

Results: The President had sent to the Board to view the head studies of Collies that had been in the materials sent from the estate of Lorraine Still by her family. None of which included the rough and the smooth collie together. It was decided that the President would further discuss with the Yearbook Editor, Kristy McTaggart. Results 11/12/20: The President presented prints sent from the Lorraine Still Estate to the CCA. But all of them were of roughs, then among the extra art pieces but none were of rough and smooths together. The only additional pieces were from this collection of Collies that were in the Illustrated Standard booklet.

<u>New Information presented to the Board on 12/28/20:</u> Recently, we received this information from Yearbook Editor, Kristy McTaggart, who told the Board that she has received a generous offer from Cindy Yeary Alvarado, so please read the details of the conversation between the President and our Yearbook Editor.

RESULTS: With updates from Kristy regarding the information provided on cover design from Cindy Yeary Alvarado the Board was happy to receive and accept this offer.

3. Update from CCA 2021 – regarding protocols for the event. The President said had just gotten an update from Robette. Herself, Jean Framke, Cindy Robinson, and Heather Newcomb along with a few others are still working on the Covid protocols. They are using models from the FL shows and Cheyenne shows. They are also working with Bradshaw who is the Superintendent.

They are going to add a Farm Dog test and a Herding instinct test for AKC titles to the program.

Once they have things finalized they will send them to the NSC to be vetted, then we will see it. We can review this and any suggestions the NSC may have. She will gladly meet with us in regards to any questions. I would say this may take place in about 3 weeks from now.

The goal is to have a safe environment for all involved and to still have our Specialty. It will not be the same but they do not foresee a reason to have to consider having a cancelation policy at this point.

RESULTS: The Board has agreed to a meeting for February 11, 2021, to make the decision on CCA 2021 after collecting data from members and applying our financial status of expenditures and income. Laura LaBounty representing CCA 2021 chair, Robette Johns, with an information presentation to the Board regarding 2021 and addressed concerns from the Board on finances. A motion made by made to call for meeting of the Board to make a conclusive vote on February 11, 2021. Correction: Discussion item #3. Results . Last sentence should read: This is a disuccion meeting of the BOD on the 11<sup>th</sup>. There will not be a vote taken until the regular BOARD of DIRETORS meeting on February 25, 2021.

4. The President presents the following information concerning the Pre-Election Committee which she has asked to look at bids from proxy companies. She said she is happy to report, the Chair Jackie Caruso, will be bringing this information to the committee which will be meeting on January 12. Then the Pre-Election Committee will be working with the Budget and Finance Committee to present the proposal to the Board.

RESULTS: Jackie Caruso presented information on the decisions made from the committee meeting where they were planning on layout and wording presentation along with a decision to select a proxy company for the Club. She has added Isabel Ososki, Chair of the Operating Manual Committee to join the group. Joe Reno and Judy Guthrie have

both said they would be happy to answer questions but after explanation of the job, felt they would not have the time to dedicate fully to this committee.

Note regarding closing the meeting: It seemed to the Board that our President was not on the phone meeting call, so Kathy Drabik, First Vice-President stepped forward to request a motion to close the meeting. The Board then voted to close the meeting later to find out that the President could hear us, but somehow her mute button was pushed and we couldn't hear her.
