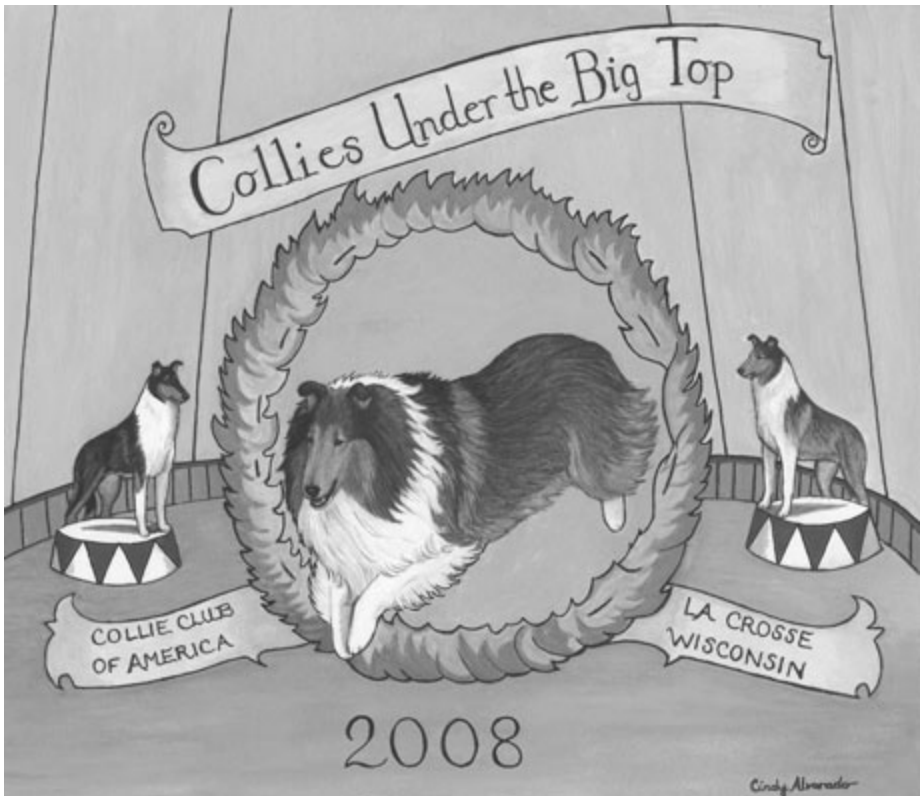

The "Best Of's" will be judged immediately after BOV (rough) and *before* BOB.

If Champions are entered in more than one class, they may not be exhibited in Best of Variety if they are defeated in any Regular or Non-Regular class.

Entries for Best of Variety judging will be brought into the ring in groups of 20 in catalog order. Dogs will be first with bitches immediately following. IF YOU HAVE MULTIPLE ENTRIES AND WANT THEM IN DIFFERENT GROUPS, PLEASE NOTIFY THE SHOW SECRETARY IN WRITING WHEN SUBMITTING ENTRIES WHETHER VIA US MAIL, FAX OR ONLINE, otherwise they will have succeeding numbers. No changes will be made after entries have closed.

Neutered dogs and spayed bitches may not be exhibited in any Non-Regular Class except Veteran Class at any Independent Specialty.

Non-regular classes involving multiple dog entries

Stud dog class- For stud dogs and at least two and not more than four of their get. Stud dogs must be entered in the stud dog class and must be shown in the ring with their get. Owner of the stud dog need not necessarily be the owner of the get. Get only to be judged on the merits of the get. While the merits of the stud dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the stud dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under Dog Show Rules, AKC policy or the standard of the breed. Get must be entered in a regular class, Best of Variety competition or some other non-regular class.

Brood Bitch Class- Same as stud dog except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

Brace- (Two dogs of the same variety and must have at least one common owner and presented by a maximum of two handlers) Dogs comprising a brace MUST be named at the time of entry. If a dog that is to be part of the brace is not entered in another class, it must be entered for "Brace Class Only". In making entered for "Brace Class Only", full particulars must be given for each dog on individual entry forms. An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as a part of a brace MUST be marked accordingly in the space provided for Additional Classes, "Brace Class". If more than one Brace is entered by the same owner, the dogs comprising EACH brace must be so designated, "Brace No. 1", "Brace No.2", etc.

As the judge's decision in the Non-Regular classes are based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible for Best of Breed by virtue of having won these classes.
